NON ZONE GAME GUIDELINES 2007

The purpose of creating this guideline is to ensure that all organizers of Non Zone games are aware of the OLA Constitutional regulations and their responsibilities as participants.

These guidelines are applicable for all Non Zone Games, including exhibition, interlock games, and Fun Days

NON ZONE GAMES MAY NOT BE SCHEDULED UNTIL THE ZONE SCHEDULE IS FINALIZED

All teams are must fulfil ALL of their Zone responsibilities. Non Zone games will not be authorized if a team has not fulfilled their Zone responsibilities.

MR6.01

"Teams in the Corporation shall not be allowed to play matches with teams or players who have been suspended or expelled for the Corporation during the period of such suspension or expulsion. Clubs so doing knowingly shall be suspended automatically, subject to ruling by the Board of Directors."

MR 6.02

"All clubs or players intending to take part in non zone games must advise presidents of both clubs, zone directors in corresponding zones of their intent to play such games. All players of the said clubs must be in good standing and games sheets for the games must be forwarded by the home club to the Zone Director and the Corporation within 48 hrs."

Also to the VP Minor

MR6.03

"A player shall not play in an exhibition game or tournament unless as a member of the association with which he/she is signed."

Non Zone Games Guidelines 2007

- No scheduled games for Peewee, Bantam, Midget "A" rated teams after July 8th of the current playing year.
- No games may be added to the schedule to act as a vehicle to serve suspensions.
- The Zone in which the game is played is responsible for any discipline, except for Abuse of an Official and bench clearing, which goes directly to the OLA. Notification must be made to the OLA immediately.
- Any fines incurred as a result of these games assessed at Zone level will be made payable to the Zone of the offending centre.
- Any team not paying fines within 30 days of assessment will risk their standing within their Zone and the OLA. Should collection of these fines become an issue it will be dealt with between Zones.
- All suspensions must be reported to the OLA office within 48 hours (max) Records of suspensions served must be sent to the OLA office as well as the Zone Director of both centres
- The referee assignor for the home centre will be asked to assign referees for the game
- Costs of such games will be mutually agreed upon by both teams, payment, if required made by cheque or money order, not cash, made payable to the Club, not to an individual.

GAME SHEETS

- Home club must forward (fax, email, mail) top copy of the game sheet to their Zone director (who will forward to the other Zone) the Corporation (OLA office) and to VP Minor within 48 hrs. Information regarding any suspensions should be telephoned within 24 hrs to those listed above.

- Any game sheet showing suspensions served as a result of non-zone games must be forwarded to those listed above for tracking purposes.

Fun Day Guidelines 2007

- Restricted for play from Paperweight – Novice divisions only
- Maximum of 3 teams per division, one must be the host team
- Restricted to ONE host day per association per playing season.
- Must be approved by the Club President and Zone Director
- Must submit game sheets to the OLA office within 7 days of completion of day for tyke and novice divisions
- If an Invitational Tournament was not granted due to non filing of paperwork OR alcohol served at a Minor tournament a Fun Day will not be granted for that year
